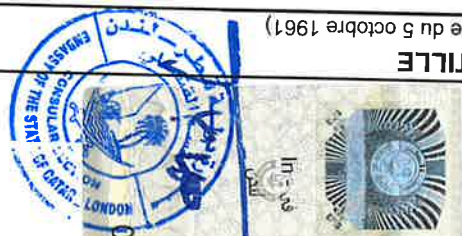

RE: POLYMERIZATION OF VINYL MONOMERS
BY CATIONIC MECHANISM

Enclosed are the results of the experiments
conducted during the visit of Dr. Wilson
to the University of Chicago.

The data show that the polymerization
of vinyl monomers by cationic mechanism
is highly sensitive to the nature of the
monomer and the conditions of the reaction.

The rate of polymerization increases
with increasing monomer concentration
and decreasing temperature.

The molecular weight of the polymer
formed is also dependent on the reaction
conditions.

The results are consistent with the
proposed mechanism for the cationic
polymerization of vinyl monomers.
